Volunteers Needed for the 2014 Resume Contest

The Office of Alumni Affairs is recruiting judges for Pitt-Greensburg's fourth annual Resume Contest, co-sponsored by the offices of Alumni Affairs and Career Services.

Part of the University's Career Month activities, is open to all Pitt-Greensburg students. Its goal is to:

- Raise awareness among students about the importance of developing a resume;
- Recognize student achievement and generate outstanding sample resumes that can be shared with other students in the future;
- Provide resume feedback from professionals with a variety of backgrounds;
- Engage alumni through a format that accommodates alumni who may not be able to easily return to campus.

Five alumni will be selected to serve as judges. Packets containing the scoring rubrics, resumes, and a return mail envelope will be mailed to judges by March 5. Deadline for returning completed materials is March 26. Judges can expect to review between 25 and 30 resumes. Winners will be announced in April.
