

WHY GO GUARD?



Every day of training in the Pennsylvania Army National Guard is a day paid. Drill pay for lower-enlisted Soldiers is approximately \$300 per drill. Drill pay increases based on your rank and years of service.

Federal Tuition Assistance, Student Loan Repayment, the Education Assistance Program, the Montgomery G.I. Bill Selected Reserve (MGIB-SR), and the G.I. Bill Kicker are all education-related benefits that can help you fund your education. Whether you've already graduated with a degree, just starting, or in the process, we can help!

Enlistment Bonuses, Life and Medical Insurance, Military Family Education Program (MFEP), and Retirement are all other benefits you can receive through initial entry or continued service in the Guard.

EDUCATION

Up to 100% Paid Tuition at State Schools
Montgomery G.I. Bill - \$439/mo
G.I. Bill Kicker - \$350/mo
Federal Tuition Assistance - \$4,000/year
Education Assistance Program - \$4,097/sem
Student Loan Repayment - up to \$50k

TRAINING & DRILLS

Lower-Enlisted Drill Pay - ~\$300
Basic Combat Training - ~\$4,000
National Guard Soldiers are paid the equivalent of two days active duty for each day at a drill.

INSURANCE & INCENTIVES

Health Insurance - Single Plans for only \$50/mo
Life Insurance - up to \$400,000
Enlistment Bonuses - up to \$20,000
MFEP - For an Additional 6 Year Contract, Receive Education Benefits for Dependents
