Program Overview & Accreditation:

- The Bachelor of Science (BSN) in Nursing is the preferred degree of healthcare employers
- The Pitt-Greensburg nursing program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate
 Nursing Education (CCNE) through the University of Pittsburgh's School of Nursing, which is
 consistently ranked among the top 15 nursing schools in the US by the US News and World
 Report
- The Pitt-Greensburg campus follows the same curriculum as the Pittsburgh campus.
 Graduates receive a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from the University of Pittsburgh.
- Housed in the Life Science Building, the Pitt-Greensburg School of Nursing offers lab and simulation experiences as part of every clinical course.
- Students receive clinical instruction at both local and Pittsburgh healthcare facilities.
- Graduates qualify to take the NCLEX to become a licensed Registered Nurse.
