<i>How many hours would I need to work?</i>	40 hours per each credit. 120 hours for 3 credits. (Average 8-10 hrs./week) (150 for IT, MIS)	Whatever is agreed upon with supervisor at internship site	Whatever is worked out upon employment
<i>How do I start the process?</i>	Completed through Career Services and Faculty from your Dept./Utilizing resources, networking, CS office, review internships of interest apply. Once you have approval and internship, complete Internship Agreement w/all signatures & Code of Conduct	Utilizing resources, networking, CS, review internships of interest and apply	Identify a job site and apply
<i>Who Supervises me?</i>	Faculty sponsor & on site supervisor	On site supervisor	On site supervisor
<i>What coursework is required in addition to work at the site?</i>	Depends on your major and sometimes what the internship site is requiring. Typically internships are completed Sophomore, Junior or Senior year.	None, unless internship site is requiring certain courses	None
<i>What insurance am I covered by (if needed?)</i>	University of Pittsburgh's liability insurance policy	Your own (if requested)	Your own (if requested)
<i>Is it paid?</i>	Depends on the site	Depends on the site	Yes
<i>GPA requirement?</i>	Check with your faculty sponsor Can also depend on the internship site	Depends on the site	Depends on the site
