Students participated in a range of initiatives that helped them build the skills and mindset needed to shape their futures.

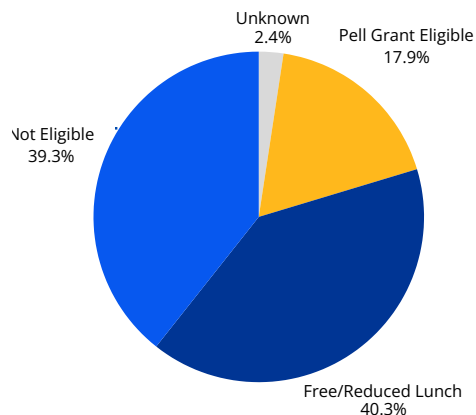

## 1,957 Participants Across Programs

### Career Academies

#### 679 Participants

The Office of Community Outreach (OCO) hosted five hands-on academies focused on career exploration in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences—led by university professors and industry professionals. The OCO also delivered in-person Career Cluster lessons, helping students connect their interests to future career paths.



### Leadership

#### 620 Participants

The OCO expanded leadership experiences emphasize leadership development, setting SMART goals and actionable steps, applying a growth mindset, emotional intelligence, and cultural agility, all supported by a dedicated success mentoring team. This is achieved through 16 programs for pre-college, college, and post-college students.

#### 282 Participants

Launched five programs to boost student engagement and strengthen campus-community connections.



## Dual Enrollment: University Preview Online

**Pitt-Greensburg expanded Dual Enrollment from 22 to 51 students over a 12-month period.**

The Dual Enrollment Program provided high school students with the opportunity to earn college credit by taking asynchronous or in-person college-level courses taught by Pitt-Greensburg faculty. Students also participated in College in High School programming, which brought university-level learning directly into their high school classrooms.



### Toolbox Series

#### 197 Participants

We offered 12 workshops on the four-year experience program, Toolbox Series. Students learned how to market and brand themselves for career readiness, communication, and research in the fields of humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.



### Financial Wellness

#### 15 Programs Offered

Financial literacy events were offered on-campus and virtual throughout the year through a partnership with Pitt-Oakland's Financial Wellness Center. In addition, we offered programs on financial literacy for parents and students.
